Victor de Boo is one of Holland's most in demand drummers. He plays for a weekly live radio show on the Netherlands Radio 6 Mijke's Middag. Victor toured Europe, USA, Canada, Australia, India, Africa, Mexico, Indonesia and has played with: Dale Barlow (Art Blakey sideman) and Scott Tinkler and Boy Edgar Award winners Wolter Wierbos, Sean Bergin and Anton Goudsmit.

Rob Armus: born in England, raised in North America began his professional musical career at the age of 16 in Canada, playing saxophone with big bands, jazz and R&B groups. In 1992 he moved to Amsterdam where he led his own groups and worked as a composer. Rob has played with many notable musicians and has toured extensively. He currently lives in Paris.
